- 1. What is the Individual Arts Assessment Pathway? The Individual Arts Assessment Pathway (IAAP) is a graduation pathway option in which students demonstrate, through a collection of creative works, growth over time that meets the appropriate High School Performance Indicators in the New York State Learning Standards for the Arts.
- 2. Who can pursue the IAAP? Students pursuing either a Regents Diploma, or a Regents Diploma with Advanced Designation may utilize the IAAP as their pathway assessment.
- 3. What is the benefit to students? The IAAP offers high school students a graduation pathway that prepares them for future professional and educational experiences and opportunities in the arts. Increasing students' engagement with the arts leads to growth in cognitive skills, such as self-efficacy, empath, and social engagement that are necessary in all areas of work and life.

4. Why pursue the Arts Pathway?

- Employers and colleges are looking for creative thinkers and problem solvers.
- It enhances applications for college, grants, and scholarships.
- The distinction prepares you for 21st century careers.
- It demonstrates your ability to commit and persevere through a rigorous process.

5. What is required of my student?

- Three units of study in the Arts programs offered
- A portfolio of student work developed collaboratively between the teacher and student
- Collection of evidence of student growth and learning
- Culminating portfolio presentation at the end of year three
